



<p>1. The corrected copy of Report of Burial dated 21 April 1948 for 1/Lt Albert W. Clark, O-729812, indicates that subject deceased was KIA 9 August 1948. This date is in agreement with corresponding information as shown on AGO Report of Death.</p> <p>2. The place of death, Le Bouillon(Orne) France as stated on corrected Burial Report for 1/Lt. Clark is in agreement with MACR #7763 for A/C 42-67359 of which Lt. Clark was the pilot and only occupant and AGO Finding of Death which states, Chartres area.,</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Coordinates for Le Bouillon: 48° 34' N. Lat. 0-06 E. Long.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Coordinates for Chartres: 48° 26' N.Lat. 1° 30' E.Long.</p> <p>3. Inscription on cross: "Here lies the body of Allied Pilot"., Lt. Clark's Aeronautical rating was pilot.</p> <p>4. Remains badly burned and mangled were removed from aircraft by Mayor of Le Bouillon. Aircraft was checked and found to be an American aircraft, P-38. Lt. Clark was flying a "P-38".</p>

9.8.44 - ObLt. Alfred Teumer, Stkp. 7./JG 54, claimed one P-38 while on Jabo sortie towards Mortain. Pl.Qu. AU 5, near Falais. Take-off time: 12.50 Uhr.
See "Stfl.Chr. 7./JG 54."

9.8.44 - 1st Lt. Albert W. Clark, 7th Photo Group, was shot down at Le Bouillon, between Alencon and Argentan, France, at ca. 13.45 hours.

III./JG 54 confirmed victories list from Winfried Bock shows ObLt. Teumer, 7./JG 54, claimed 1 x P-38 in Pl.Qu. AU 5 at 13.32 hrs. on 9.8.44. This P-38 was undoubtedly the F-5 Lightning claimed by Teumer. Note that 7th Ph.Gp. MACR indicates Clark and wingman Sommerkamp were attacked by small number of Fw 190s, which fits known circumstances of III./JG 54 equipment and activity.

(BLACK OUT PARTS OF BODY NOT RECEIVED AT CEMETERY)


